The details of the action taken

The proposed certificate course in Educational Management for Teachers was approved. Syllabus for this course was formulated and got approved from Board of Studies, Academic Council and Governing Body. This certificate course commenced from III Semester of B. Ed. two year programme of 2016.

- New Benchmarks for B. Ed 2 year course was suggested by IQAC. After a series
 of discussions with Subject Experts, Curriculum Committee Members, a Choice
 Based Credit Structure was derived for M. Ed. course and a Credit Based
 Evaluation Scheme for B. Ed.
- There were suggestions for formulating electives and new areas of courses.
- CCE and its workability were discussed and industrial personnel from WIPRO, NASSCOM suggested to module evaluation rubrics to test learning outcomes not only based on memory but on areas of intent from the learner's point of view. This is being taken care in formulating description in SAT records.
- Consortium was an important aspect discussed. The panel of consortium member's selection and launching the first agenda is in progress.
- Improvement in Reading Comprehension is being taken care:
- 1. Through Certificate Course in Conversational English
- 2. Through Class Room Activities using discourse, discussion strategies.
- Integration of B. Ed &M.Ed. courses is taken care through internship programmes of M.Ed. students teaching the B. Ed's, through competitions and pairing them for any academic and cultural activities.
- Memorandum of Understanding regarding activities of Research under Consortium is in the progress.
